Mr. Hugh Gaitskell, University College, London, was so kind to give me your address. I am an economist of the Viennese circle and was appointed at the Austrian Institute for trade cycle research. The Institute lost its independence and I was given leave two weeks ago; it must be decided after a short time if I shall keep my position or not. I can judge the situation perfectly well and I know certainly that I shall not return to the Institute. I am therefore looking for a position abroad that would enable me to carry on scientific and independent work. If you should be in a position to do anything for me I would be very obliged to you. I include a curriculum vitae and I hope that I have not omitted any details which may be relevant for you. I further include letters of recommendation from Prof. Hayek and Prof. Strigl.
